"Sacred Artifacts and Disturbed Contexts: a Rockshelter in Patchaug State Forest"

- The Office of State Archaeology was involved in the excavation of seven small features each containing stone effigy pipes, copper and stone pendants, and copper beads. Although resembling Native American finds from other parts of North America, these artifacts are apparently unlike any ever discovered elsewhere. While laboratory and other analyses are in progress, the soil context of the features is highly questionable. These features may represent very recent deposition, and the artifacts themselves may be rather new.
